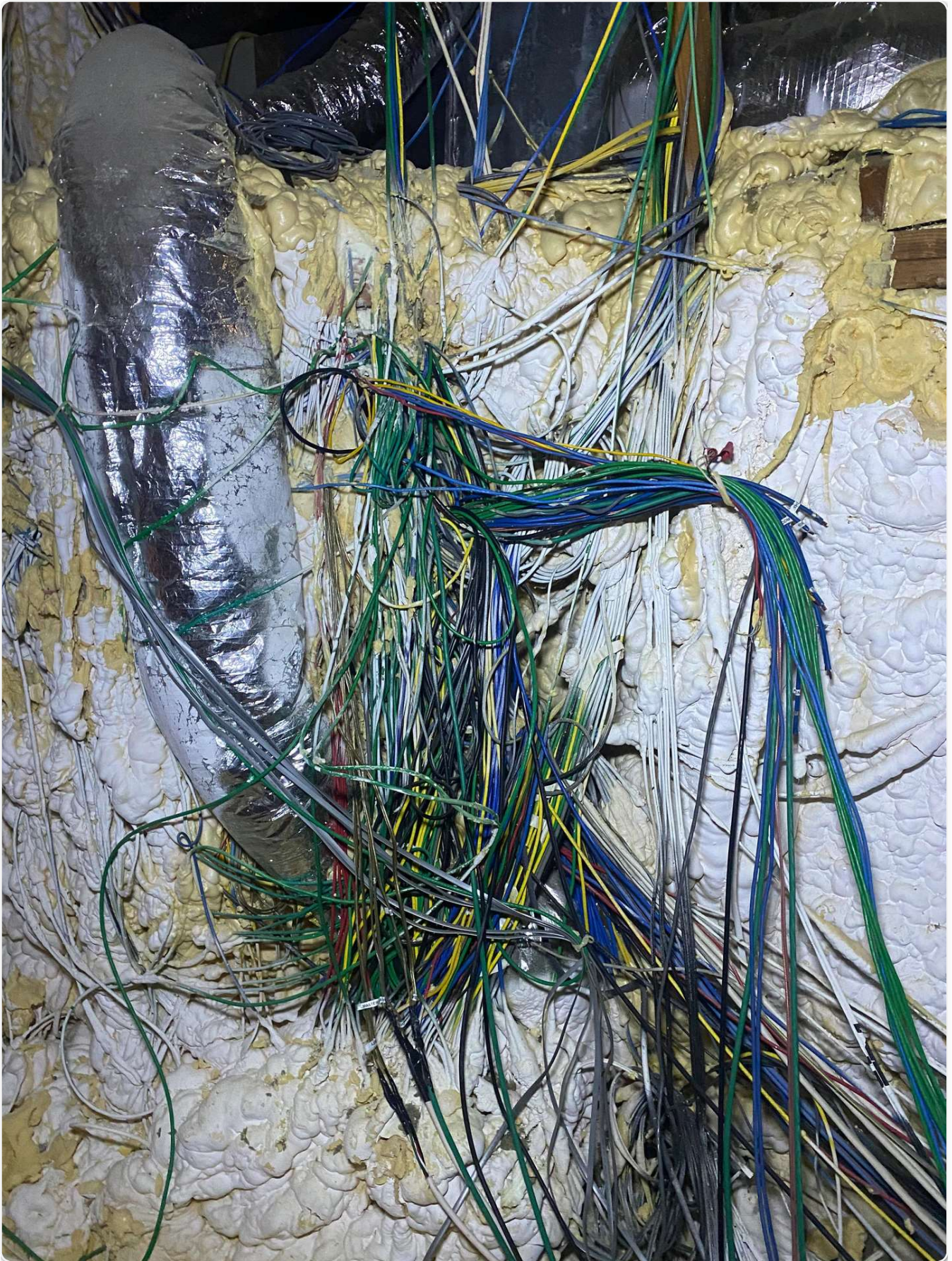
Who does this? - Cabling photos

In a world filled with scenes of abject "cablefail" and grievous "cablegore," there's always plenty of blame to go around.

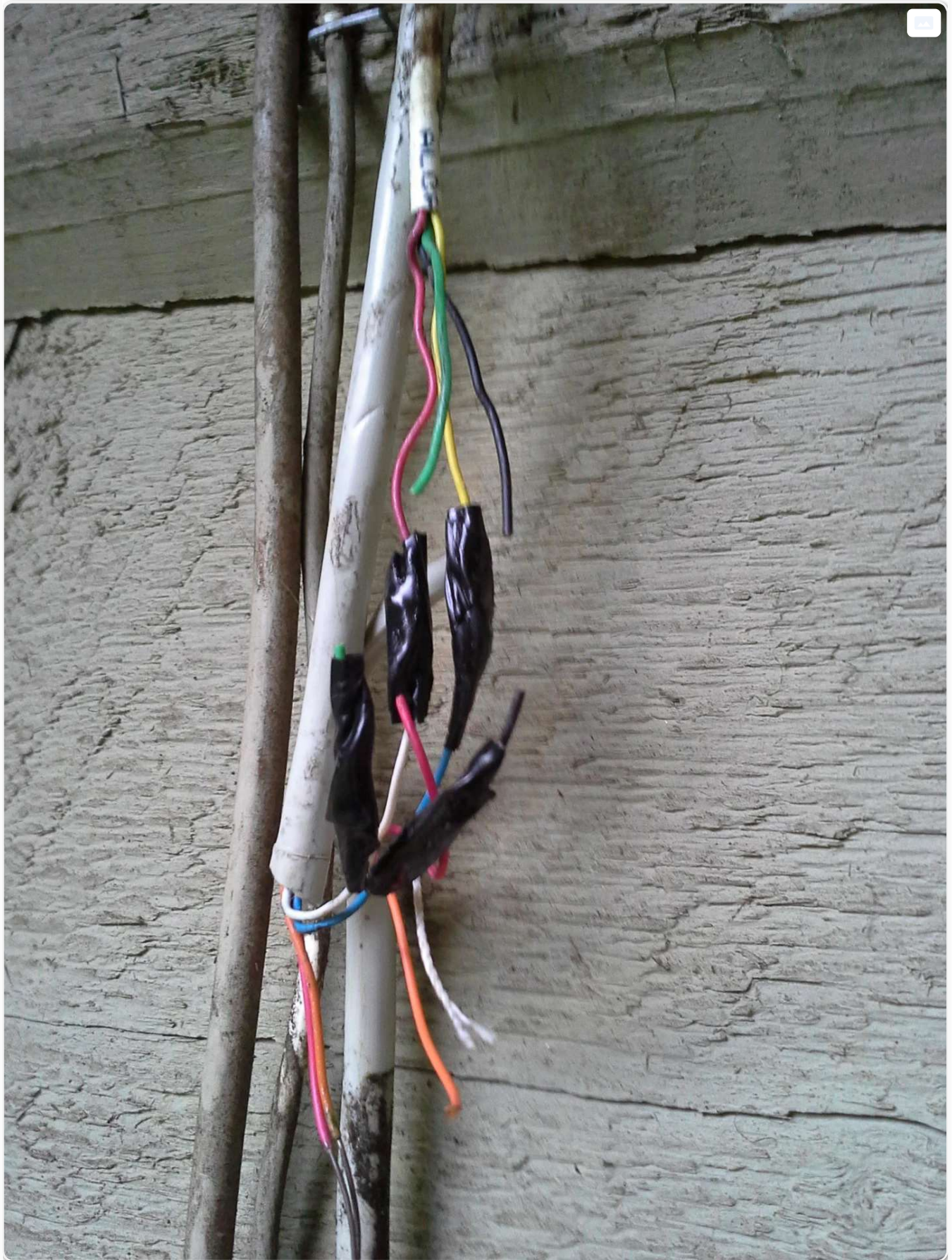

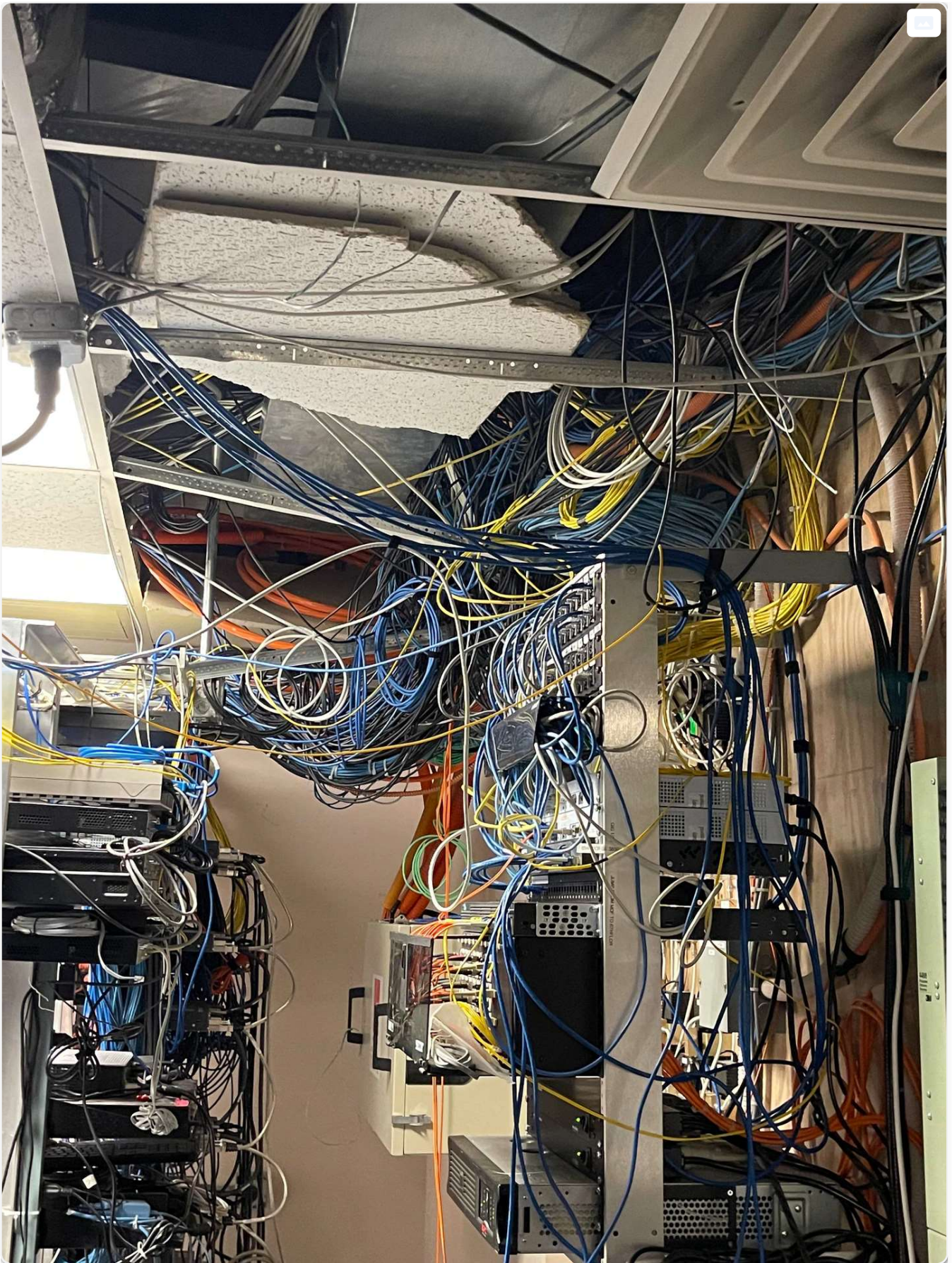




"Who does this to other people?" -- Reddit/Cablegore OP [orig. poster]:
